DVD-Video Tells The Story of Our National Parks

The National Park Service programs are undergoing a DVD-video revolution. Most new National Park Visitor Center programs are playing DVD video, says Eric Epstein of the Harper's Ferry Center, the branch that develops program content. "Some players run on continuous loop or are started by pushbuttons, providing visitors with a quick overview of the parks or programs integrated into museum exhibits, Epstein said. "Others run in dedicated theaters, often with high quality projectors, surround sound, and accessibility features such as caption displays. They run almost every day of the year, 8 hour or more per day."

- Ellis Island Immigration Museum, New York Harbor.
- Steamtown National Historic Site, Scranton, Pennsylvania.
- Great Smoky Mountains National Park, Tennessee and North Carolina
